The Music Department boasts three concert bands, a symphony orchestra, junior and senior string orchestras, five choirs and several small vocal ensembles, a big band and many chamber groups. All ensembles perform regularly at school and in the local community. Each year the School stages its Annual Speech Night at the prestigious Hamer Hall and music is a feature of the evening.

Apart from presenting concerts throughout Europe, students and staff look forward once more to learning more about the cultures of the countries we visit, broadening their musical experiences and making new friends.

The 26 students attending this tour are aged between 14 and 18 and are in Years 7 – 12 at School. They have formed a Touring Choir as well as a number of smaller chamber groups. A String Ensemble will feature in the concerts. The concerts will include presentations of outstanding vocal and instrumental soloists. A wide variety of repertoire will be included in the concert, ranging from sacred choral music, concerti to toe-tapping swing numbers.
